PREP LITERACY


- At Parkdale Primary School we follow a MSL-OG Structured Synthetic Phonics approach to literacy. Students are explicitly taught letters and sounds, they then use these letters and sounds in their reading and writing.
- We are very proud of our literacy approach and the results it yields.






EVOLVING LITERACY INSTRUCTION

- Previously (and still in many schools) children were taught using a balanced literacy approach, this is not evidence based. Children are taught to guess at words and think about what makes sense, rather than using the sounds in front of them.
- Children are taught a bank of sight words they need to remember and then guess using the pictures.








LITERACY INSTRUCTION AT PARKDALE

- Students are explicitly taught letters and sounds.
- We initially begin with the letters S, A, T, P, I, N and then move our way through the alphabet.
- Once the students know these letters we send home books that only include these letters and can be decoded.
- We introduce words that can not be decoded such as 'the' and 'said' gradually.
- Students experience success and the process is not as overwhelming.

LITERACY INSTRUCTION AT PARKDALE

- We teach the students to read and recognise individual sounds.
- We explicitly teach students how to form letters
- Students are also explicitly taught to write words using the sounds we have learnt
- Our Foundation students begin writing words and sentences from term 1
- Again because students are supported and gradually introduced to the alphabet they experience success and are so proud of their learning.











LITERACY INSTRUCTION AT PARKDALE

- Over the year we focus on different genres of writing once the children can confidently record words and decodable sentences.
- Recounts
- Procedural writing
- Persuasive writing
- Narratives (we write fairytales)
- Information Reports

FOUNDATION MATHS

- At Parkdale we teach 5 strict hours of maths a week.
- We use fluid maths groupings to target children's individual needs.
- We mix students across the year level and place them in a group that targets their individual needs.
- Students complete pre and post test before each topic and will move groups depending on their results.







FOUNDATION MATHS

- We cover the three strands from the Victorian curriculum; Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability.
- Our teachers expose students to the concepts using hands on materials.
- We regularly review topics.
- Our aims is to make learning maths fun and exciting!







INQUIRY

- Throughout the year we cover 4 different Inquiry topics (one per term).
- All About Me
- Healthy Me
- Transport
- Animals









SOCIAL SKILLS

- At the beginning of the year we explicitly teach the students about our Super 6 Values (respect, resilience, cooperation, integrity, responsibility, excellence)
- Students learn about the 'Zones of Regulation'
- Focus on mindfulness and gratitude



SPECIALIST PROGRAMS

Students attend each specialist once a week. Lessons run for 50 minutes. We offer the following specialists at Parkdale:

- Physical Education
- Visual Arts
- Wellbeing/Digi Tech
- Performing Arts
- Japanese





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- All students from Foundation participate in one session of PE each week
- All students in Years 1 to 6 participate in one session of PE and three sessions of sport per week.
- House Carnivals include: Swimming, Athletics, Cross Country, Fun Run.
- Inter-school Sport opportunities from Year 3 6 including Athletics, Cross Country, Swimming, team sports (Netball, Soccer, T-ball, AFL, Hockey, Softball, Volleyball, Rounders, Cricket, Tennis), Hoop Time Basketball.
- Swimming program from Foundation to Year 6. All students participate in swimming lessons every day for two weeks.
- Bike Education formal Year 5 Bike Education program for all students and then optional participation in the 'Bike It' competition and Year 6 Bike Camp.

VISUAL ARTS

- Students attend one 50 minute Art session per week.
- Foundation students are introduced to a range of art making techniques and materials through the elements of art.
- Grades 1 6 learn to use different art mediums and explore techniques whilst responding to and interpreting artworks, historical and contemporary artists, literature and cultural events.
- Art Club runs once a week at lunchtime. Students can come in practice mindful colouring and drawing with our Art Leaders and other students.

PERFORMING ARTS

- Students attend a weekly Music session offering opportunities for creative self-expression while building skills in musical literacy, and confidence in composition and performance.
- Students begin in the early years developing their first instrument their own singing voice and through fun singing games, learn to sing in tune.
- Students play, create and compose using a variety of percussion instruments including marimba, xylophone and djembe drums.
- Recorder is taught from Year 3 and ukulele in Years 5 and 6.
- Creative dance and other dance styles are part of the Performing Arts program.
- Every second year, Parkdale Primary has a concert performed at the Palais Theatre in St Kilda.
- Every other year, the students perform a Christmas concert.

JAPANESE

- Every students from Prep to year 6 attend a 50 minute Japanese session per week.
- The purpose of learning a language at primary school is most of all to open children's minds to culture diversity and also develop their language awareness in both English and other languages.
- Lessons are centred around having fun and wanting to learn a different language than the one already spoken.
- Japanese lessons have an emphasis on play and imaginative activities, games, music and familiar routines.
- Various forms of multimedia are utilised to engage students and reinforce vocabulary.
- Every year Parkdale Primary organises a Japanese day, when students have the opportunity to dress-up and participates in Japanese-based activities. We usually invite amazing incursions on the Japanese Day.
- Once a week students from all grades can attend a Japanese cultural club such as Origami Club and Anime/manga Club at lunch time.

WELLBEING/DIGITECH

- All students from Foundation to Year 6 participate in one 50 minute lesson per week.
- Students are taught to identify emotions and calm down strategies.
- Cyber safety and cyberbullying are taught from Foundation to Year 6. Once this
 area has been covered extensively, a technology agreement is made with the
 students from 3-6.
- In 2022 we had our first Wellbeing Day when the students participated in...
